Settle the budget: decide who will pay for what. Hire a wedding consultant. Schedule your minister and begin premarital counseling. Reserve wedding and reception sites. Book the caterer, baker, florist, photographer, videographer, musicians and DJ. Create the guest list. Select and confirm your attendants.
8-10 Months Before Reserve a block of hotel rooms for out-of-town guests. Register with at least three gift registries. Order your wedding gown. Begin planning the honeymoon. Order invitations and announcements. Schedule an engagement photo session in time to have photos by month 6. Begin planning the rehearsal dinner. Meet with your florist for ideas.
 6-7 Months Before Choose the men's formal wear. Order all the attendants' dresses. Select music for the ceremony and reception. Send engagement announcement to newspapers. Meet with the baker to choose the wedding cake and groom's cake. Choose your hairstyle.
4-5 Months Before Meet with your florist to finalize decisions and place order. Order all decorations not covered by florist, including rental items. Order napkins and other reception necessities not covered by caterer. Meet with the caterer to select menu. Meet with a photographer and a videographer to select packages. Meet with the musicians and DJ to finalize decisions. Finalize honeymoon plans, make all the reservations, and order all tickets.
 3 Months Before Order wedding bands. Purchase gifts for all the attendants and your fiancé. Plan the seating arrangements for the rehearsal dinner and reception. Make two appointments with your beautician – one for a trial run and one for your wedding day.

	2 Months Before Mail the wedding invitations. Finalize accommodation arrangements for out-of-town guests. Submit all tuxedo sizes with the formal wear store. Purchase your shoes, lingerie and other wedding-day accessories.
	1 Month Before Pick up wedding rings. Complete all final fittings. Have your bridal portrait taken. Finalize plans for the rehearsal dinner. Prepare all the necessary forms for name and address changes. Have your programs printed. Write thank-you notes as you receive gifts.
	2 Weeks Before Get the marriage license. Give invitations to the rehearsal dinner. Make sure you have all the clothes, shoes and accessories you'll need before, during and after the wedding. Buy clothes and supplies for the honeymoon. Reconfirm honeymoon reservation and transportation plans. Address announcements to mail on your wedding day. Touch base with caterer, baker, florist, photographer, videographer, musicians and DJ. Start "breaking in" your wedding shoes at home. Create a wedding day schedule to hand out at the rehearsal.
	1 Week Before Provide the caterer with a final guest count. Throw or attend the bridesmaids' party and give their gifts there. Appoint someone not in the wedding party to handle last-minute concerns. Try on everything you plan to wear the day of the wedding, including undergarments and jewelry. Pack for the honeymoon. Pack your wedding-day bag.
<u>-</u>	The Day Before Relax! Enjoy the company of a few close friends and family members. Attend rehearsal and rehearsal dinner. Get plenty of rest.
	The Big Day! Eat a good breakfast. Give rings to the best man.

Creating Your Wedding Day TIMELINE

One important but often-overlooked aspect of wedding planning is creating a schedule of the big day. A schedule helps plan for all the traditions you want to include and helps avoid any slow or dull moments for your guests.

Pro tip: If you can't afford a wedding planner, you can hire a day-of coordinator to keep your wedding day on schedule. You can thank us later.


Will you include a first look? Whether or not you include a first look will determine a lot about your schedule. For example, if there is no first look, you'll need to coordinate with your photographer for photos after the ceremony versus before.

Which traditions are in? Which are out? Is the first dance important to you but cutting the cake is not? When making your wedding day schedule, consider how much or how little time to give to each event based on your personal preferences.

Consider the time of year. Weather and daylight hours will determine a lot about your schedule. If the sun sets at 5 pm, consider an earlier ceremony. If it's still blazing hot outside at 5 pm, consider a later ceremony.

What's important to your guests? Think about your friends and family and how they like to celebrate. Would your folks love a long, traditional ceremony or something short and sweet? Are they the type to dance the night away? Do you hang out with a bunch of foodies? Your schedule can reflect how you and your people like to get down.

Pad, pad, pad. A common complaint newlyweds report is that the day felt rushed. Be prepared for each event to take longer than expected and pad your schedule so you can relax and savor each moment instead of rushing to the next thing.

Couples are increasingly writing their own wedding vows in order to make their wedding a more personal and unique experience, to have a chance to express their truest feelings from the heart, and to take the first step into marriage with vows specific to their goals. While the heart and soul that go into the vows are genuine, it can be difficult for a bride- or groom-to-be to put those feelings into words. They may be worrying if they're saying the right thing, if they're forgetting something, or they may have a case of writer's block. While writing your vows can be difficult, it will be so worth it at the altar. Here's a guide:

- 1. Create a framework with your fiancé. The first thing you must do is discuss the guidelines of the vows with your fiancé. How long will they be? Will you write them together or separately? Should they be similar or very different? Are there any topics that should be off limits? Creating a set of rules and guidelines will narrow the scope of the vows, giving you a good jumping-off point.
- **2. Write down a list of things you love about your fiancé.** Start your vows by telling your fiancé why you love him or her and why you're excited to be marrying them. Think about the big things and little things the way he always makes you feel beautiful to the way she laughs when she's watching her favorite TV show and express how you can't wait to continue loving those things for the rest of your life.
- **3. Tell the story of when you first fell in love.** When did you first know your fiancé was The One? Tell your unique story. "I first knew you were my future husband when you ..."
- **4. Write down a list of promises.** From the big -- "I will love you in sickness and in health" -- to the small -- "I will kiss you each night before bed" -- this is your chance to profess to your future spouse all that you intend to bring to the table to give him or her a happy life.
- **5. Incorporate a romantic quote or religious verse.** Is there a Bible verse you and your fiancé relate to? Or maybe there's a romantic poem or quote that comes to mind. Include it in your vows and explain to your fiancé why that quote reminds you of him or her.
- **6. Practice, practice.** Like any public speaking endeavor, practicing what you will say aloud will help you become more comfortable. Just don't over practice to the point that you're reciting your vows by rote. You'll want to speak with emotion when you're at the altar.

Seating Charts

The Who, What, Where, Why and How

To seating chart or not to seating chart? This increasingly foregone wedding tradition has its merits and deserves to make a comeback. Here's the lowdown on wedding-seating charts and why you should consider having one.


Why have a seating chart? They can help avoid awkwardness as people try to decide where to sit and who to sit with. It also avoids an empty table or over-crowded table.

Where should guests be seated? The general rule of thumb is "VIP Family Members=Closer Seats." Parents and grandparents are usually seated at tables closer to the bride and groom, while co-workers and the younger crowd won't be offended if they're seated further away.

Who sits together? Group people based on their relationship to you. Seat you co-workers together; your college friends together; and so on. And those feuding relatives? Separate tables.

How do guests find their seats? The two mainstays are either a large seating chart or escort cards. As far as how you present them? The possibilities are endless!

What faux pas should be avoided? The singles table. Not all singles are trying to meet someone, and your single friends might resent feeling as though they've been inadvertently set up on a blind date.





Couples today have lots of options to consider from event venues and chapels to outdoor pavilions and even Airbnbs! With so much variation, be sure to tick off these five questions as you look.

Is there plenty of space? Have a good idea of your guest count before you shop, and make sure your venue will have plenty of space to designate areas for eating, drinking and partying. The last thing you want is for your tables to take up the whole dance floor.

Is there good lighting? Not having proper lighting is a common regret couples report having after the wedding. Does the venue have large windows to let in natural light? If not, is there ample lighting to light up the space?

What's included, and what do we need to bring ourselves? This greatly varies from venue to venue and can be a big determinant based upon your budget or how much creative control you want to have.

Who will be our point of contact as we plan our wedding and on the wedding day? This is an often-overlooked question. You will have questions as you plan, so be sure to set up proper channels of communication to avoid a headache later.

Are there different rates for different days of the week? Time of day?

Season? Couples looking to pinch pennies may be able to opt for a slightly off-season wedding and, in some cases, a Sunday or mid-week wedding.







lowers are among the most important (and most expensive!) facets of any wedding. Bouquets, boutonnieres, decorations, centerpieces, the altar -- flowers are everywhere! To prevent your foray into merry matrimony from being riddled with wedding debt, here are some tips and tricks for beautiful florals without breaking the bank.

Buy in Season, Buy in Bulk

Research the flowers that are in season at the time of your wedding -- they will be cheaper than out-of-season blooms. If you choose just one or two types of flowers, your florist can purchase them in bulk, and you will get a better deal. And be flexible -- focus more on the colors you are looking for rather than the type of flower. This will give you more seasonal options, and more options means more opportunities to save.

DIY

Websites like Pinterest are jam packed with do-it-yourself instructions for beautiful bouquets, table runners, decorations, hair wreaths and more. Get some friends together and have a fun DIY party one or two days before the wedding.

Keep It Simple

A trendy centerpiece look is using several tiny vases with two or three blooms in each one. Scour antique stores and flea markets to find a collection of mismatched vases that will give your tables an eclectic, vintage look. Another way to scale back costs is to downsize the bridesmaid bouquets -- there are several pretty petite bouquet trends out there.



Keep it real. Your special day is a classy event. Save the fake flowers for your craft closet.

Statement blooms. Splurge on your dream flower for the focal point. Buy it in a smaller quantity and spread it out. Complement your statement flowers with cheaper, filler options like greenery (eucalyptus, lemon leaf or pittosporum) and low-cost florals (spray roses, football mums and wild flowers).

The bride's bouquet. Have a professional arrange the bride's bouquet -- this is the most important flower arrangement of the day. Just about everything else can be DIY'd.




